Dr. Julie Kim is a Board-Certified Internist with over 20 years of medical experience. She has been serving as Medical Director of Brain Treatment Centers in Newport Beach, San Diego, and Cardiff since 2013. She has dedicated the last decade to helping those in need of MeRT (Magnetic e-Resonance) therapy and has treated 5,000+ patients with MeRT at the flagship BTC center in Newport Beach. As the most experienced MeRT clinician worldwide, she was asked to use her knowledge and expertise of MeRT to train and support other physicians to utilize the technology and spread the use of MeRT for Wave Neuroscience.
